The species list conforms to the American Ornithologists' Union (AOU), checklist order and nomenclature as of the 57th supplement published July 1, 2016.

- []** = Species in brackets have not been physically documented in Arizona (3 species)
- *** = Arizona Bird Committee review species (161 taxa)

- italics** = Species in *italics* are identifiable subspecific forms (64)
- (int)** = Introduced (8 species)
- (ex)** = Extirpated (4 species) previously bred or presumed to have bred in Arizona, but no longer occur naturally. They may have been reintroduced but remain unestablished.
